

- Our district is focused on creating opportunities to ensure achievement and success.










EARLY CHILDHOOD CURRICULUM

A TYPICAL KINDERGARTEN CLASSROOM






PROGRAM OPTIONS


Kindergarten Options:

Traditional Kindergarten

Students must be five (5) on or before September 1st

- Transitional Kindergarten (TK)*
 - * Students who turn five (5) between September 1st and by December 1st

- Read age-appropriate text.
- Use comprehension strategies.
- Use a combination of drawing, speaking, and writing to tell stories.
- Know conventions: grammar, spelling, and punctuation.




OUTCOMES

MATHEMATICS

By the end of Kindergarten, you should expect your child to:

- Count to 100 by ones and tens.
- Recognize and write numbers 1-20.
- Understand greater than, less than, and equal to.
- Classify objects into categories.
- Solve basic addition and subtraction problems.






